

## I. Macomb County, Oakland County, & Wayne County CRF Funds | Overview

### Macomb County – Pending

### Oakland County

From the Oakland County Pandemic Response & Economic Recovery Committee meeting:

- OC has engaged Consultants—Pierce Monroe and Associates working with the Guidehouse Group (reportedly they are part of the team in DC working with the Treasury Department), to assist them in determining how best to disburse the CRFs.
- OC has also engaged a consultant to help identify available grants and help apply for additional FEMA funding.
- By the next meeting (2 weeks), the Oakland County Board Chair hopes to have a proposal drafted for non-profits and other entities to determine eligibility and provide direction on how funds can be used, as well as a mechanism to get the funds out into the community.
  - The proposal will be a topic of discussion but will not be finalized at that time.

### Wayne County

From the interim Director of Economic Development | Wayne County. EC is developing recommendations for CRF funding focused on divided the funds into four categories;

1. Assist businesses to create a safe environment that restores customer confidence.
2. Prepare for the second wave of COVID-19, anticipated early this fall.
3. Stimulate the entrepreneurial spirit to develop new products and services to address COVID-19 and related issues.
4. Train the workforce to produce the products needed to fight COVID-19.

The recommendations will be forwarded to the Wayne County Executive Leadership by May 15th, and upon approval the recommendations will be forwarded to the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

Wayne County's Health Department is providing the EC with the amount needed to fund Public Health from now until 12/31/2020. This amount will be used to determine the needs of Wayne County operations, which may equal 50M and reduce the CRF award for appropriations.

The goal is to utilize the CRF funds for more than just PPE.

#### **Category 1 - CREATING SAFE ENVIRONMENTS**

- Create guides, by business sector, regarding best practices
- Host webinars to promote best practices and provide advice
- **Provide grants** to underwrite the cost of making modifications to create a safe environment
- Launch a media campaign to reassure residents that it is safe to work in and patronize businesses

- Encourage restaurants to find creative ways to expand capacity and support this by creating or eliminating municipal restrictions and providing grants to help them develop additional seating and production capacity
- Work with DDA's, retail center managements and others where a concentration of businesses exists to create safe events to encourage residents to patronize local businesses.

### **Category 2 - PREPARING FOR THE NEXT WAVE**

- Ensure that all Wayne County residents have access to high speed internet, so that every family can participate in distance learning if schools are closed and work from home if that is practical for their job
  - Provide computers where needed
  - Subsidize internet service where needed
  - Provide cloth masks to all 280,000 public school children in Wayne County

Strengthen the food chain

- Ensure that meals can be delivered to the most vulnerable by providing subsidies and other assistance to restaurants to prepare and deliver those meals. This has the advantage of both providing meals where needed and revenue for the restaurants during times of low/no patronage.

Develop creative, flexible strategies for working parents that have day-care issues Darsi

Strengthen local food chain to prevent disruptions to availability and prevent food going to waste

- Find methods to get excess food distributed to those in need (example, avoid the dumping of milk)
- Support farmers markets
- Encourage, support and provide land for urban farming by Wayne County residents

Push for State legislation to allow Bridge cards to be used to order food online for delivery

### **Category 3 - STIMULATING THE ENTREPRENEURIAL SPIRIT OPPORTUNITY**

- Create a competition to develop new products, software applications and services to address COVID-19 related issues
  - Provide grants for award winning ideas
    - Grants will be awarded in different amounts for:
      - Proof of concept
      - Prototyping
      - Pre-revenue
      - Scaling Up efforts
    - Grants will be provided by category
      - Medical devices
      - Enhanced monitoring (ex., Contact Tracing)
      - Predictive Systems
      - Safety
      - Protections for at risk populations
      - Testing
      - Other innovative ideas

**Category 4 - WORKFORCE TRAINING OPPORTUNITY**

- Develop a training initiative and/or support existing training initiatives, which will provide an opportunities for Wayne County Residents to transition from low skill/low paid jobs to higher skilled/higher paid careers in:
  - Manufacturing advanced medical devices and PPE
  - Construction trades for making modifications to facilities
  - Health care workers for areas of healthcare staffing needed for fighting COVID-19

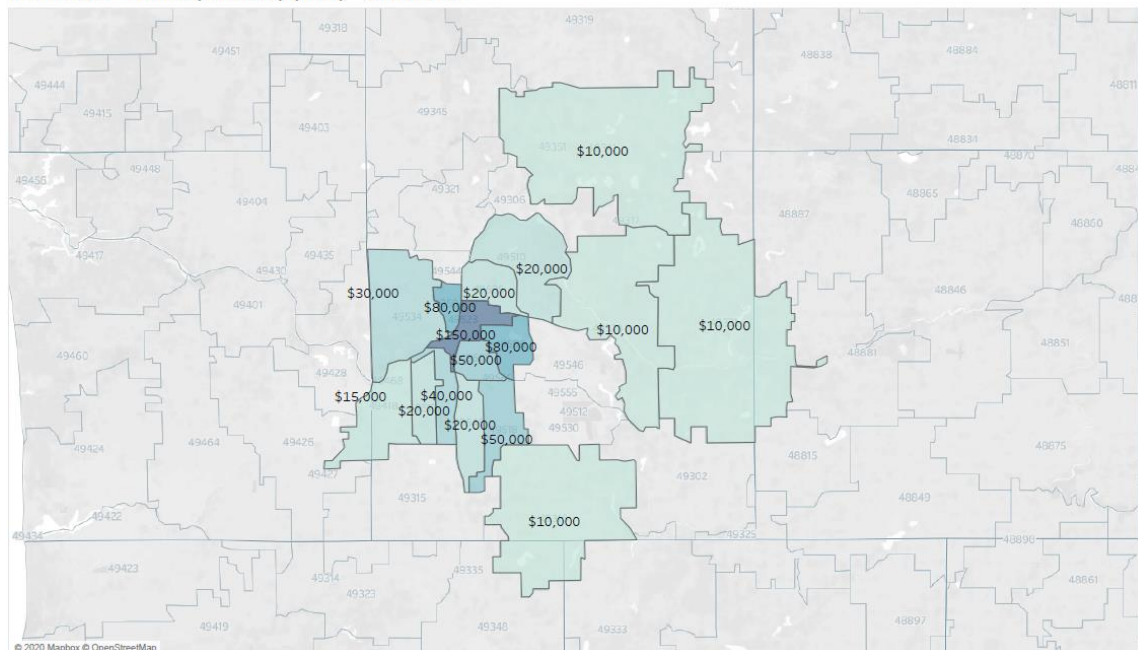

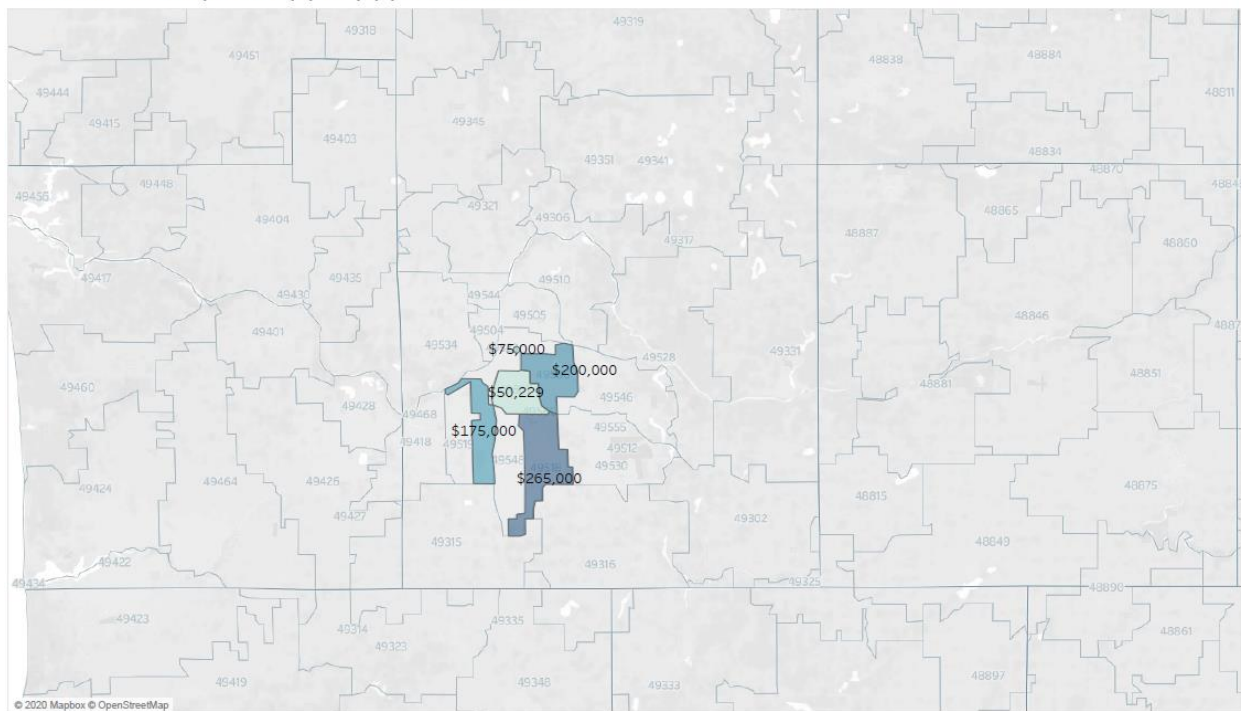
**Michigan Small Business Relief Program Finalist – Grants**
